

Questions and answers

Q. [How does my child become a member of the Children's University?](#)

A. You can collect a form at reception and return it to Mrs Levy with a one-off, £10 fee.

Q. [What does my £10 cover?](#)

A. Your £10 covers the cost of a passport and hire fees towards their cap, gown and graduation venue each year.

Q. [My child attends a club away from the school, who do I contact to get the club validated?](#)

Q. [My child has their first 30 signatures/stamps. Who do they need to see?](#)

A. There is box in each classroom to place passports. The class ambassador will give the passports to Mrs Levy on Tuesdays.

Q. [Who will take my child to a learning destination?](#)

A. The Children's University supports learning outside of the school day. Therefore, as parents and carers, we would encourage you wholeheartedly to take your child to the various Learning Destinations and spend some quality time together as a family. As a school, we will provide the after school clubs that can also be a part of your learning journey with the CU

Q. [How does my child obtain the credits/hours?](#)

A. Your child must attend a CU learning destination, whether it is an **approved** afterschool club(See Mrs Levy) or an **approved** outside destination(email Jessica to check).

If it is an afterschool club at Parkhill Juniors, he/she will only be credited half an hour per session. The maximum credits for after school clubs will be 10 hours as the CU suggest that your child has many different learning experiences towards their awards.

If it is an outside learning destination, the same rule applies per activity e.g. My child attends an **approved** karate class for one hour every week. This is great! Your child can obtain 1hrs credit(as it is not in school) per session up to a maximum of 10 hours for this activity, then you should try something new.

All members will now have access to the CU half term activities. These will be given out by their teacher at the end of every half term. Each of these is also worth one hours credit! There are usually 6 hours to collect.
