






Every week we would like you to reflect upon your learning.

After reading the article, we would like you to complete a drawing where you have considered your response carefully.




#### Article 28: I have the right to an education

Article 28 of the UNCRC says that children and young people have the right to education no matter who they are: regardless of race, gender or disability; if they're in detention, or if they're a refugee.

Children and young people have the right to both primary and secondary education and should be able to choose different subjects when in secondary school.

This should include the option of technical and vocational training, so they shouldn't have to focus on academic subjects if they don't want to.










## - Share a pencil day -


