

Have another look at the picture from yesterday



You work for the company that is providing the Lego bricks for this construction. You need to include a set of instructions for the builders.

First step, decide what building type these blocks are going to be used for. Maybe a house or a school? Maybe a gym, a restaurant? Discuss your ideas with an adult.

10 - 15 minutes: Activity 1

For the first part of today's lesson, you will need to prepare vocabulary that you can use for your instructions.

You will need to think of:

- Imperative verbs; those 'bossy' verbs that tell the reader what to do *e.g. make, put, click together, push*
- Adjectives for the different parts *e.g. large, small, circular*
- Time conjunctions that show you are moving onto the next step *e.g. next, after that, secondly, then*

Now you have decided on your building that the blocks will make, you need to write your instructions. Remember, Lego kits normally have a lot of pieces, so your description will need to be really specific! Look at the example below to help you.

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1. Firstly, unpack all of the pieces and separate them into shapes; rectangular, square and circular.
 2. After that, locate the largest square piece. This will be the base of your restaurant.
 3. Next, take the white rectangular pieces (there are four of them) Click each one together to make the walls of the restaurant.
