Have another look at the picture from yesterday



You work for the company that is providing the Lego bricks for this construction. You need to include a set of instructions for the builders.

First step, decide what building type these blocks are going to be used for. Maybe a house or a school? Maybe a gym, a restaurant? Discuss your ideas with an adult.

## 10 - 15 minutes: Activity 1

For the first part of today's lesson, you will need to prepare vocabulary that you can use for your instructions.

You will need to think of:

- Imperative verbs; those 'bossy' verbs that tell the reader what to do *e.g. make, put, click together, push*
- Adjectives for the different parts e.g. large, small, circular
- Time conjunctions that show you are moving onto the next step *e.g. next, after that, secondly, then*

## LI: I can write a detailed set of instructions

Now you have decided on your building that the blocks will make, you need to write your instructions. Remember, Lego kits normally have a lot of pieces, so you description will need to be really specific! Look at the example below to help you.

- time conjunction imperative verb
- 1. Firstly, unpack all of the pieces and separate them into shapes; rectangular, square and circular.
- 2. After that, locate the largest square piece. This will be the base of your restaurant.
- 3. Next, take the white rectangular pieces (there are four of them) Click each one together to make the walls of the restaurant.
