LI: I can write creatively using descriptive vocabulary

You will write and edit your piece over the next two days. **Your final, edited piece needs to be handed in by Thursday 25th June at 3:30pm**



Yesterday, you began to think about 'Fruit City' - a city where all the buildings, vehicles and landscape are made of fruit. You built up a word bank of what different fruits could do, and today you are going to write your descriptive piece!


Let's look at an example:

- **Idea: All the swimming pools are fruit smoothies instead of water**

Now let's turn that into a descriptive sentence.

When you visit the Smoothie Swimming Pools, you'll be amazed to dive into a pool of luscious strawberry smoothie instead of water! The diving board is made of a fruit-roll up, meaning you get a good bounce when you dive in!

Now it's your turn. Use your ideas from yesterday (and any other new ideas you now have!) to write a descriptive piece of Fruit City. Be creative and be unique; this is your chance to create a whole new world through your writing!



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LI: I can proofread and edit a piece of writing

Step 1: Proofread to edit mistakes

Like any good author, you must remember to always check your writing for any mistakes and edit it to make it even better. Brilliant writing takes time and lots of drafts! Use this checklist to edit your mistakes:

- Check your writing for spelling mistakes
- Make sure your grammar is correct
- Make sure your punctuation is accurate

Step 2: Now it is time to enhance your writing.

Use Tom Palmer's checklist to go back and edit your writing:

- Read your work aloud so you can hear the impact, what you like and what you want to change
- Add extra descriptive detail
- Take away- cross out words/ sentences you don't think are suitable
- Replace- change words/ phrases for better ones
- Read it aloud again. How does it sound now? Does it reflect the character you are writing as?
