



Today's architect is Spanish. His name was Antoni Gaudí.
(25 June 1852 – 10 June 1926) Gaudí's works have a highly one-
of-a-kind style. Most are located in Barcelona, including his main
work, the church of the Sagrada Família.


Gaudí's work was influenced by his passions in life: architecture,
nature, and religion. He considered every detail of his creations and
integrated into his architecture such crafts as ceramics, stained
glass, wrought ironwork forging and carpentry.


