- Create atmosphere using figurative language: metaphors, similes, personification, pathetic fallacy

- Select verbs forms for meaning and effect
- Use adverbs, prepositions and extended noun phrases to add detail
- Use a range of cohesive devices, including adverbials
- Use punctuation for clarity and to create meaning

Your writing does not need to be longer than a page and remember to use paragraphs. You could also think about adding in speech to move the action along.
