

If your child is absent before or after a school holiday, you must provide evidence explaining the absence. This may be medical evidence if your child is unwell or evidence of flight delays or circumstances beyond your control. Without this evidence, you risk being issued with a penalty notice.

Health and Safety

We encourage all our children to walk, scoot or cycle to school. Minimising the volume of traffic around the school is our ongoing challenge. We need your continued support with this. Please do not park on the yellow zig zag lines or across the driveways of local residents.

At the top of our list of priorities, is the safety of our children.

Pollution outside the school is increased by the number of vehicles bringing children to school. We receive daily notices, on behalf of the Mayor of London, reporting pollution levels in the area. 4N showed their balancing skills during our gymnastic session. They demonstrated determination and concentration.


'In indoor P.E, I found balancing fun. When balancing, I found standing on one leg challenging but if I focus I can do it.'

Year 5 have had such a tremendous year! A year of new and exciting learning. Through their numerous educational visits and outdoor learning, they have made links with their class learning experiences along with fabulous memories. Read on, to enjoy their learning experiences.

Geography

Our 'field trip' to Clayhall Park and the surrounding areas proved informative. The children had studied the area maps from 1897 through to 1939 – seeing the physical features change due to human impact. The childen were fascinated to see the change from fields to streets and houses.

An absolutely super day was had by all at the Soanes Science Centre, where all pupils were immersed in their learning, as they became conservationists to answer the question, 'Do we need to feed pond animals?' and, 'What do pond animals eat?' The children worked collaboratively, making scientific observations, researching and discussing findings to draw their conclusions.

Science

They made predictions about which type of boat would move the quickest – using scientific vocabulary, such as water-resistance and carried out investigations to find out the effect of airresistance on their home-made parachutes.




A big 'Thank You' to all Year 6 class teachers, parents and pupils for all your hard-work and support. Without you, our journey together would not be possible.

Are you caring for a child who is not yours?

Private fostering is when someone who is not a close relative cares for another person's child under the age of 16 (18 if disabled) for 28 days or more.

A close relative is considered to be an aunt, uncle, grandparent, step parent or siblings. Friends of the family and other family members such as cousins or great aunts are not classed as close relatives for the purposes of Private Fostering, neither are families hosting overseas students who are being educated in the UK.

You need to legally notify us of any private fostering arrangements in Redbridge to ensure the child is safe.
