Our Year 3 children have settled in and found their feet, enjoying the many aspects of Parkhill Junior life. Please read on to see what our excited, high performance learners have been up to...

English

Year 3 were immersed into their class text, *The First Drawing*. It is a historical text based in Stone Age times. So far, we have written diaries, poems and persuasive speeches from the character's point of view!

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Science

Our topic this term is Animals and their Bodies.

The children have been introduced to the skeletons of various different animals, including humans. They have learnt names of specific bones, their functions and how they differ depending on the animal.

Computing

'I like it when we learn outdoors because we can move around and it helps us remember what we have learnt.'- Zoeya 4N


















In science, we simulated our digestive system using tights, crackers, orange juice and a banana. The results were very messy, but helped us understand the processes involved in digestion.

Science


The children have been focusing on properties of materials. In lessons they have explored different types of materials and the properties they have. They have also experimented with solubility and which substances dissolve in water.




"I enjoyed experimenting because we are linking the different features of items. I liked how we used sweets to prepare us for sorting different types of animals!" Neal, 6H

English

In English, we've been reading *The Silver Sword*, by Ian Serraillier.

We have been using the book to write our version of the Balicki children's escape, from their home, after German soldiers arrested their mother. A range of drama techniques helped us develop our high performance attitude of *empathy*. This helped us really understand our characters. We are also learning about different word classes and how these can be brought together to create descriptions that are engaging and entertaining for our reader.
