High Performance Learner	High Performance Learning March
Sonum - 3O	Sonum used her creating skills in order to write a letter to an ancient Egyptian Medjay. She used powerful persuasive features, taught in previous lessons, as well as new features which showed originality in her writing.
Aayan - 3B	Aayan has shown that he is hardworking, through perseverance. He has been working on using finger spaces and letter joins all year and he has achieved using both, successfully.
Ahmad- 3C	Ahmad has improved his handwriting and presentation by being hardworking through practice and repetition.
Shreya - 3G	Shreya used her enquiring skills to describe a village using geographical language. She carefully observed some images and used additional comprehension knowledge, to elaborate more about the area.

Ibrahim - 5C	Ibrahim was able to effectively skim read secondary sources to ensure that he has chosen the most appropriate pieces of information to be able to create fact file about the Amazon Rainforest. He used his home learning to find additional facts which he was also able to include. Ibrahim was creative, hardworking and resilient when creating his fact file.

Karan - 30	Karan produced a high quality piece of discursive writing. He used his linking skills and was able to see other points of view in his work. Karan wrote arguments 'for' and 'against' Kukulkan taking the cocoa tree from the gods and giving it to the Maya people.
Ayla - 3B	Ayla used her connection-finding skills to make links between her knowledge of multiplication tables in order to answer fraction questions.
Armaan and Amelia 3 C	Armaan and Amelia are empathetic learners, working collaboratively and listening to each other to solve a multi-step word problem about fractions. They also used their meta thinking through strategy planning.
Saian - 3G	Saian chose one of the most challenging questions in maths and worked his way through a fraction maze, strengthening his problem-solving skills in the process. Fabulous!
Teodor- 4A	Teodor showed his hard-working skills through practice in his art lesson. His self-portrait is a reflection of his determination to work through a challenging task. When comparing it to his previous portraits, Teodor could clearly see a huge improvement!
Saif- 4N	Saif has shown resilience in order to improve his presentation, bringing it to a high standard, taking on board feedback, with a positive attitude.
Aadam - 4DO	Aadam for his self-portrait, linking to his artwork and reflecting on his previous knowledge to produce an outstanding and detailed drawing.
Humaira - 4H	Humaira for using her analysing skills to get inside the head of one of the characters in our book 'Beowulf'. She wrote a wonderfully descriptive diary entry, showing the emotions of the character.
Zara- 5C	Zara worked systematically following a formula and adequate steps to get her answer. She has shown her linking skills by recalling her previous learning and applying it to angles.
Kyan - 5R	Kyan has collaborated with his peers to create a research project on the Amazon Rainforest. He was able to link his previous knowledge from our initial learning on rainforests around the world and analyse the various features and characteristics of the biomes. He then applied his skills to the final piece which was not only informative, but also visually appealing to the audience.
Shaambavi - 5P	In science, Shaambavi has worked hard to find links and connections across different topics. She has been able to accurately transfer knowledge, gained last half term in our animal and plant life cycles unit, to our new unit - the human life cycle. Shaambavi used scientific vocabulary in her work to ensure she completed it to a HPL standard.
Aliyah-5A	Aliyah has worked hard in English linking her prior knowledge of diary features and her inference skills to write a very emotive and detailed diary entry. She was able to create her own success criteria to check and edit her in order to create more of an impact on her reader.
Hari- 6I	In English, 6I enacted a court case in preparation for our writing. Hari played the role of Macbeth where he was on trial for the murder of King Duncan. Hari used the HPL skill, empathy as he was able to use inference to help him gain understanding of how Macbeth would have felt and what he would have said He was agile with his thinking, as at times, he adapted what he said in order to stay in role when the defence or prosecution asked questions.
Isha - 6H	Isha not only used her meta-thinking by solving problem using an efficient strategy, but she then helped her partner to understand what to do. She used the VAA of empathy and collaboration and in doing so helped to consolidate her own understanding.
Esa, Aarlin,	This group demonstrated HPL skills in designing and building their battery-powered moon buggy.
Abiha and Mustafa- 6F	Realising their initial design needed to be adapted, they showed agility and meta-thinking in deciding how to improve their chassis and pulley system. They showed great empathy in the sensible and polite way they communicated with each other.
Hawwa - 6S	From using her hard-working behaviour of practice and her HPL skill of realising, Hawwa's arithmetic scores have increased considerably since the start of the year. This is a fabulous achievement and demonstrates how through determination and desire to achieve, you can do anything you put your mind to.
