

During our Outdoor Learning Day, Year 4 embraced the opportunity to take their learning outdoors. They utilised their observational abilities to classify both animals and trees. Additionally, the children used natural materials to create large pieces of weaving.

Take One Picture – Arts Week

We kick started this half term, by celebrating Arts Week. Year 5 analysed the painting of, 'A Courtyard of a House in Delft,' by Pieter de Hooch and linked the piece to each subject. The children carried out research, using secondary resources and compiled this, with their knowledge of the painting, to create their own interpretation of Hooch's work.

In science, the children have been using their high performance skill of enquiry to become scientists and carry out experiments. We have created our own hypotheses and carefully considered the control, dependent and independent variable of each experiment. The children have deduced conclusions from their results and made accurate links to our curren topic, forces.
