"I like history because we learn about tools from a long time ago." Laith – 3D



Science

Our topic this term in science is 'Teeth and the Digestive System'. We have focused in on tooth decay, which is also linked to our PSHE unit of nutrition and dental health. We discussed how we could look after our teeth and what causes decay. We are also learning about the different parts of the body that are involved in the process of digestion.



History

As part of our high performance skills approach to learning, we were given the question, "What was it like to live during the Blitz?" We used a range of historical sources to answer the question above. As historians, we used our observation skills to note key details and from these we inferred what it was like at that time.

English

In English, we've been reading 'The Silver Sword' by Ian Serrailier. We have been using the book to write our version of the Balicki children's escape from their home after German soldiers arrested their mother. We used a range of drama techniques to help us develop our HPL skill of empathy. We are also learning about different word classes and how these can be brought together to create descriptions that are engaging and entertaining for our reader.

Art

We are designing a tote bag based on our history topic. Using our enquiry skills, we researched different images related to WWII. We drew these carefully in our sketchbooks. Then we had to put our ideas together to create a cohesive design. Next we had to consider colour. As we are printing, we are only allowed to use three different colours. It has been challenging to decide which ones to select.
