4G Romilda	Romilda has demonstrated <b>self regulation</b> by focusing very hard on a particular maths concept, addressing her errors and improving her <b>practice</b> within a session!
4A Hussain	Hussain used his <b>linking skills</b> to make a logical prediction about a science experiment we were doing in class, using his prior knowledge. Then he used what he learned from the experiment to write an analytical observation.
4H Inaayah	Inaayah used her <b>meta-thinking</b> and <b>analysing</b> skills to first collect information and then create a chart. The bar chart made it very easy to display this information to others.
5MA Ellie Mae	Ellie Mae wrote an excellent non-chronological report using her skills of <b>hardworking</b> through perseverance. She included powerful vocabulary to engage her reader. Well done!
5J Shreya	Shreya used her knowledge about the Spanish Armada, to create a motivational and aspirational speech to rally the English troops, as Queen Elizabeth I, to wage war against the Spanish! <b>HPL skill of linking.</b>
5S Deimantas	Deimantas demonstrated the HPL skill of <b>hardworking</b> . He wrote a wonderful speech from the perspective of Queen Elizabeth I, as she addressed her troops before battle.
5WA Izzah	Izzah has demonstrated <b>meta-thinking</b> in her recent English writing by adapting language to suit her audience and editing to improve before redrafting.

## Year 3

This month has been filled with inspiring moments of progress and discovery. Our pupils are actively embracing every learning opportunity and demonstrating the qualities of high-performing learners. Their hard work and positive attitude are shining through, and we look forward to seeing their continued growth.

#### First Aid Training

Our learners took part in an exciting and educational first-aid session, where they were introduced to key life-saving techniques. The children practised how to respond safely and calmly in situations such as severe bleeding or breathing difficulties. They approached the training with great enthusiasm and responsibility, and many expressed how confident and capable it made them feel.

#### Mask Making

The children explored colour, pattern, and creativity while designing their own unique masks. They experimented with different paint combinations, showed great concentration and imagination, and expressed their individuality through bold and vibrant artwork. Each mask turned out brilliantly, reflecting both effort and precision.

#### R.E.

This term, our topic is "Why do religious people celebrate?" The children have been learning to reflect on what is worth celebrating in their own lives. "It was so much fun to do maths outside. It was really hard when the teacher started to give us timetables in French" -Ahmed, 4H








#### Geography


## Year 6

#### Science

We participated in a practical lesson to understand how exercise effects bodies and heartrates! Each lesson has encouraged us to use and improve our High Performance Learning skills.









#### Art
